

Korean ambassador attends event at NSU

SOUTH Korean ambassador to Bangladesh Park Young-Sik attended the ambassadorial talk at North South University on Monday.

The programme was organised by the Centre for Peace Studies of the South Asian Institute of Policy and Governance and the office of external affairs at NSU. The title of the talk was 'Modern Korea: History, Democracy, Economy, Peace, and Security'.

Professor Atiqul Islam, vice-chancellor of NSU chaired the session. The event was moderated by Katherine Li, director, OEA, NSU while CPS coordina-

tor Abdul Wohab delivered introductory speech.

Ambassador Park Young-Sik said that the Korean government wanted to embrace greater roles and responsibilities for resolving regional and global challenges and preserve universal values including freedom, democracy, human rights, and the rule of law.

In a concluding note, he said that Korea and Bangladesh could further develop bilateral relations in a mutually beneficial way.

'Building on what we have achieved over the past five decades, it is now high time for both countries to make the next 50 years even more prosperous,' he added.
